## Well-Child Visits in the First 15 Months of Life (W15)

Percentage of members who turned 15 months old during the measurement year and had six or more well-child visits with a primary care provider during their first 15 months of life

## Well-Child Visits in the Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Years of Life (W34)

Percentage of members ages 3–6 who had one or more well-child visits with a primary care provider during the measurement year

Percentage of children age 2 who had four doses of diphtheria, tetanus and acellular pertussis (DTaP) vaccine; one hepatitis A (Hep A) vaccine; three doses of hepatitis B (Hep B) vaccine; three doses of haemophilus influenza type B (HiB) vaccine; two doses of influenza (flu) vaccine; three doses of polio (IPV) vaccine; one measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine; four doses of pneumococcal conjugate (PCV) vaccine; two or three doses of rotavirus (RV) vaccine (dosage varies by vaccine manufacturer); and one chicken pox (VZV) vaccine on or before their 2nd birthday
